The EU Better Regulation Policy

Better Regulation:

- Good governance
- Legal certainty → efficient application and enforcement
- Positive impact on framework conditions for growth, employment and productivity
 - Right incentives for businesses
 - Cutting of unnecessary costs
 - Removal of obstacles to adaptability and innovation

Better Regulation

- Better Regulation tools:
 - a) Impact assessments (ex ante)
 - a) consultation
 - b) Screening of pending legislative proposals
 - c) Simplification of existing EU legislation (ex post)
 - d) Administrative Burden reduction (ex post)

Impact Assessments

- Prepares available evidence of potential impacts of alternative policy options
 - balanced and proportionate way
 - Integrated approach covering economic, social and environmental impacts
 - aims to identify possible trade-offs / synergies
- > For political decision-makers
 - Absolutely <u>not</u> a substitute for political judgement!
- > Transparency

IA steps

- > Problem definition
- Objectives
- Identification of options
- Analysis of options
- Monitoring and evaluation

Impact Assessment

- > Since 2003 more than 300 IAs
- > IA guidelines updated in 2005
 - Greater emphasis on competitiveness issues and admin burden
- Impact Assessment Board since 2007
 - Examines all Commission IAs
- External evaluation
 - Guidelines and process currently being revised
 - Extension of scope
 - Proportionate analysis criterion refined
- > Strong commitment to BR and IAs now and in future

Screening of pending proposals

- Focus on proposals adopted before 1/1/2004
- > 183 proposals screened, 67 withdrawn (via publication in OJ of 17/03/2006)
- > Repeated in 2006 for a further 79 proposals (10 withdrawn)

Simplification

- Aims to modernise and streamline the acquis
 - Four main methods
- Repeal
 - Removes from the statute-book those legal acts which are unnecessary, irrelevant or obsolete
- Codification
 - Means bringing all amendments to a given law adopted at different times into one law
 - Contributes to the reduction in volume of EU legislation

Simplification

> Recast

- Combines in a new legally binding act both the amendment of the substance of the legislation and the codification of the remainder which is intended to remain unchanged
- Repeals the acts which it replaces
- > Revision
 - clarifying the text (e.g. definition, scope etc.);
 - reducing administrative burden
 - improving the functioning of the Internal Market
 - adapting the text to technical progress

Simplification- Achievements

- > A total of 94 initiatives tabled to date
- Corresponds to 300 legal acts removed from the Community acquis

e.g.

- the "Single Payments Area" in the EU which could save the EU economy up to €28 billion per year,
- the new electronic Customs Code which will boost international trade and save businesses up to €2,5 billion/year;
- The simplified rules and incentives for SMEs developing pharmaceuticals;
- The repeal of most existing pre-packaging requirements allowing free sizes for all pre-packaged products.

Administrative Burden

- > Aim: reduction of the admin burden by 25%
- Labour efficiency = increase in the level of GDP of c. 1.4% (EUR 150 bn)
- > 13 priority area
 - Mapping, field measurement and reduction proposals
- > Fast track actions
- > High level group of independent stakeholders

Mapping of information obligations (IOs) stemming directly from EU legislation – finished early spring '08

Mapping of IOs stemming from national implementation of EU legislation – ends spring 2008

Development of reduction recommendations, targets, proposals, economic projections, dissemination of results and miscellaneous activities – ongoing throughout project, concentration in late 2008 Early spring '08
